Thematic Units - Third Grade

Big Picture: The story of Jesus and his church.

Third grade focuses on being a member of the church, learning about the parables and miracles of Jesus, and learning the Apostle's Creed. The rosary is also an important feature in the year.

Notes:

- SWBAT = "Student will be able to...."
- The standards are numbered according to where they are placed in the curriculum. This is an organizational guide and you can ignore it.
- Red is review of material which was previously taught.
- Green indicates preview of items which will be taught and reinforced in subsequent years.
- Blue indicates suggestions of topics / strategies / supplemental material which have been tested and used successfully.

Prayer and Spirituality through the year - How can I pray on my own?

Prayer is integrated throughout the year.

Goals and themes:

Begin to take responsibility to pray on one's own.

Reinforcing ways to pray individually and in common.

Seeing the Rosary as a way to reflect on the life of Jesus.
