Now let's get to the lesson for this class.

To do that we return to the story of Elijah and Queen Jezebel. God told Elijah to return to Israel to confront Ahab and Jezebel. This time Elijah addressed Jezebel in particular. He challenged her priests and followers of Baal to a contest on Mt. Carmel. He told the priests of Baal to prepare a sacrifice and then ask their false god Baal to make it burn.

- Please have your student read 1 Kings 18:25-40 to learn how this contest turned out and what happened to the priests of Baal.

This made Jezebel very angry and so Elijah and his follower, Elisha, (who would become his successor) fled to Mt. Sinai.

- Please have your student read 2 Kings 2:11-12 and tell you what happened to Elijah.
- To learn the grisly end of Jezebel please have your student read 2 Kings 9:30-37 and explain this to you.

Following this episode the northern kingdom of Israel turned from idolatry and experienced a period of prosperity. But eventually idolatry returned and the kingdom declined. In came Assyria, one of the major powers of that time and place.

- Please have your student read Pages 176 and 177 in the Sadlier textbook and explain in his or her own words what happened to the people of Israel.

Despite the danger that Assyria would also conquer the southern kingdom of Judah, God sent the prophet Isaiah to tell the people that would not happen (although the Assyrians came close in 721 B.C.). In an even more important message, Isaiah made a bold prediction.

- Please have your student read Isaiah 61:1-3 and Luke 4:16-22. Ask your student to put these two passages together and tell you in his or her own words what was predicted.

A new king (Josiah) started Judah back on the proper path to worship of the true God.

- Please have your student read pages 188 and 189 of the textbook (return to unit 3 and find chapter 16) to learn the fate of Judah, Jerusalem, and the people of Judah. This event has come to be known as the Exile.
